We're so very glad you can be at church today, there is nothing better than starting the week focusing on the important things of life. Taking a break from our everyday concerns and stopping to thank God for his goodness to us, learning from His word and encouraging others to keep trusting Jesus for those everyday concerns. Today we're reflecting on one of the great stumbling blocks Christians (and non Christians) fall over when they think about how to relate to the God of the universe. People have a very high opinion of themselves and so figure that good deeds they perform should make God happy. Down through the ages people have sought to make their peace with God by offering some sacrifice: doing good, being selfless, giving, the list is endless, however there's a problem people like to ignore. They still want to live as their own god and just keep the true God happy by throwing him a few bones of their good deeds on occasion.

If I left my wife and my rightful obligations as a husband, ran off with some other woman and went to live in Africa. And if I did wonderful and loving things in Africa, helping people, even achieving spectacular things for the good of many Africans, how do you think my wife would view such 'good deeds'?

No matter how much good I do, until I have made my peace with Anne, until I've apologised and done everything I can to undo my wrong, I am not going to have a relationship with her.

It's exactly like that with the God we have ignored. If we are unwilling to seek out a reconciliation with Him, we remain a stranger to Him, and He's not impressed with any feeble attempts to suck up to Him while we still want to live as our own god. (Matthew 7:22-23)

But the story doesn't end there, even those of us who have made our peace with God can still be blind to how our relationship with God should work. Christians can live in a prison of the law of God, doing good deeds, feeling they have to, to keep God happy. They fail to realise their happiness will only be found in loving God and His purposes for them, rather than a legalistic and slavish keeping of God's commands.

Jesus talked about his burden being light, if you can get to the stage of loving what God loves, it is no burden at all, but the joy of knowing the grace of God.
