Synod Week 2

Good morning and welcome to Church. It's great to have you here especially if you're new or visiting. We'd love to meet you after church over a cup of tea.

This week was the final week of the Synod of our Diocese. There were quite a number of significant things discussed and decided, I'll fill you in on just one this week.

I have already mentioned the report that was produced which showed in some detail the data regarding declining church attendance across our Diocese over the past 10 years. This week we discussed that report. There was universal agreement that we would love to see that statistic reversed. People were not completely agreed on what has caused the decline and on what our response to that decline should be.

Firstly, has the decline been caused by our churches and ministers not having done well enough at reaching the lost? This was certainly the opinion of some. We all must agree that there are certainly many ways in which we have fallen short, and many moments we could have done more. I'm not convinced that the statistics prove that this is the cause of the decline. Had we grown by 20% we would still need to acknowledge our weakness. That said, it is worth reflecting on how we might do better and considering to what extent the decline is our responsibility.

I strongly suspect that there are other factors also at play. Church attendance has been in decline in almost all of the western world for some time. (This not the case in the rest of the world, overall Christianity and the church are growing significantly). Our society has changed rapidly in the last few decades. This doesn't mean people won't become Christians, but it does mean we might need to think carefully about how to reach them with the good news of the gospel.

One thing will not change. In the end, people are saved by the power of the gospel. We need to bring God's word to people and pray that God himself would be at work in them. It should be a great comfort to us that God has promised that He will indeed build His church. We know which way we would like to see the numbers go on a local level, but we must be in no doubt that God's plans will be brought about.
