Singing Praises

Good morning and welcome to Church. It's great to have you here especially if you're new or visiting. We'd love to meet you after church over a cup of tea.

After last weekend's uplifting Carols service at St John's, this weekend we will continue to sing! On Saturday night at Mt Wilson then Sunday morning at St Aidan's and across the road in the park on Sunday night.

But why do we sing? In some ways it's quite obvious, we sing because a baby was born and so there should be a great celebration. And yet, I suspect if you wandered down to the maternity unit at the hospital you will rarely find a birth celebrated in song. In modern Australian culture, communal singing is not a common occurrence.

In the scriptures, we find a different picture. The Old Testament is filled with musicians and songs praising God. When Paul and Silas were in prison (Acts 16) they sang praises to God. Singing was a normal part of Israel's worship and is immediately taken up by the early church.

More specifically, there was singing at the birth of Jesus. No singing from Mary or Joseph (though Mary did do some singing during her pregnancy). No singing from the Shepherds. It was the heavenly host of angels who sang. I suspect the reason that the angels sang was because they could see a fuller picture of what was going on. They knew who it was who had been born into the world. They knew how extraordinary it was that God Almighty had been born as a human baby.

And so they sang. We too have the privilege of now seeing that bigger picture, of knowing what this life would bring. And so we too shall sing.
